Alan Joseph Mallow, 49, of Washington Court House, Ohio passed away on Thursday, June 13, 2013 at 5:30 P.M. at Robert Packer Hospital in Sayre, PA.

Mr. Mallow was born to Joseph and Carolyn Mallow on October 1, 1963 in Washington Court House, Ohio. He graduated from Washington Senior High School in the Class of 1982 and entered the United States Marine Corps in September 1982 and retired in October 2006.

He served as Master Sergeant where he was a Drill Instructor (6 yrs) and Utilities Chief (18 yrs). During his military service, Alan completed extensive military training through several programs and as a result, he was awarded numerous medals based on his levels of achievement.

After his military career, Alan became a contractor with Impact Recourses based in VA. He had been working in Afghanistan for the past 3 years.

In high school, Alan was a member of the ROTC unit for 4 years where he held the position of Commander of the Color Guard multiple times, and was a member of the Drill and Rifle Teams. He was also active playing various sports including basketball, cross country, and baseball which was his favorite. He worked part-time at the Blue Drummer during high school.

His passion for playing ball continued into adulthood as he competed in various adult softball leagues. His favorite pastime was watching baseball.

During his childhood, he attended St. Colman Catholic church where he was an altar boy.

He is survived by his parents, Joe and Carolyn of Washington Court House, OH; his son Kyle Mallow of Springfield, MO; daughter Kristen Mallow and son Kurtis Mallow, both of Rome, PA; Sherrie Mallow, the mother of his children; his sister, Susan (Mike) Mills and brother Mark (Tamika) Mallow, both of Washington Court House, OH. He is also survived by 3 nieces and 1 nephew, aunts, uncles, and many cousins and friends that loved him dearly.

Alan was known as a giving person and even in death, his giving continues as his donation of tissues will touch the lives of so many in need.

Funeral services are pending and will be announced later. A memorial service in his home town of Washington Court House, OH is also being planned with details to be announced at a later time.
