Amy S. Harrigan, 81, a resident of Athens, Pa., went to be with her Lord Saturday evening, Dec. 28, 2013. Born in Waverly, N.Y. on Sept. 21, 1932, she was the daughter of the late Clayton and Pauline Rouse Struble. A devoted wife, mother and grandmother, she was the widow of James "Dick" Harrigan, who preceded her in death on Aug. 1, 2010. She also dearly missed her brother, Edmund Struble, who predeceased her many years earlier. Amy was a 1950 graduate of Athens High School, and was subsequently employed by the Ingersoll-Rand as a secretary. Amy and her husband Dick were partners in their family business, Harrigan Awnings, Windows, Doors and Siding, for many years. Amy was a long time member of Our Lady of Perpetual Help Catholic Church in Ridgebury, Pa., where she and her husband spent many volunteer hours. Amy enjoyed gardening, reading, antiques, needlework, traveling, camping, canoeing, walking the family dog and biking. She was a Robert Packer Hospital Hospitality Cart Volunteer, and helped with Girl Scout troops and the Catholic Daughters as her daughters grew. Just like her husband, Dick, Amy was a conservationist, who proudly donated Harrigan Island, located behind their home in Athens, to the Northcentral PA Nature Conservancy, for boaters, canoeists, and kayakers to utilize as a stop-over location on the Susquehanna River.

She is survived: by children Patricia (Harrigan) and William Peck of Sherburne, N.Y. and granddaughter Tamara; Kathleen (Harrigan) and William

Chabala of Mansfield, Pa. and grandson Ethan; Maureen (Harrigan) and Timothy Rhodes of Nottingham, Pa. and grandchildren, Judson, Christine and Brittany; sister-in-law Jeanne Harrigan Gallagher of Punta Gorda, Fla., along with many nieces and nephews.
