Edward Eugene Andrus, 70, of Elizabethtown, PA passed away early Friday morning, October 15, 2021 at his home following declining health. Edward was born in Sayre, PA on July 25, 1951 the son of Harry Robert Andrus and Theresa Jo Martin Andrus. Edward grew up on the family farm and the farm of Hugh Andrus both in Burlington Township.
