Eleanor Dianne Fields never liked to be called by her first name and therefore she never was. Born April 23, 1950 in Farmville, N.C., Dianne was the youngest of three daughters of J.W. (James William) and Ethel Edmundson Fields. She often did things her own way and on Friday, Dec. 29, 2017, after years of deteriorating physical health, she left her earthly home and joined her parents and her precious older sister Joan Fields Taylor to walk streets of gold and meet her Savior face to face.

Even though her physical health had faded, her wit, humor, and tender personality (mixed with a whole lot of Southern sass) remained strong and infectious. She was often ready with a good joke, liked people to laugh and have fun, and, even during the most dire of situations, could find a way to lighten the mood.

In her younger years, she loved to knit and cook savory Southern food.

Dianne enjoyed a variety of careers throughout her life including store clerk, beautician, and flower delivery person. No matter her job, she could easily bring a smile to the face of those she met. She enjoyed watching QVC and Food Network (her favorites were David Venable, who she called "my David" and The Pioneer Woman), and old movies. She loved music and while growing up, she loved The Beatles while her sisters clamored after Elvis. She

was also obsessed for many years with Christian singer Carman and enjoyed the Gaither Vocal Band and other Christian artists.

She was fascinated by new technology and time saving gadgets. Even though she was living in Pennsylvania, she used technology to keep in contact with friends and family and remain connected with the city of Jacksonville and the state of North Carolina, which she always considered "home."

Though sometimes hurt by others, she never let her personal pain stop her from loving others deeply and fiercely. She gave her heart to Christ in 2009 while in the hospital after a heart attack and was quoted as saying "If I could dance around this room right now, I would."

Her audacious spirit, her contagious laugh, her tender heart wrapped beneath a sometimes rough exterior, will be greatly missed by those honored enough to call her sister, sister-in-law, niece, aunt and great aunt.

Dianne is survived by her sister Carolyn Fields Robinson and brother-in-law Ronald G. Robinson, of New Albany, PA, whose home she was a part of since 2009; her nephew Bryan G. Robinson, and his wife Kimberly Robinson, of Wellsboro, PA; niece Lisa Robinson-Howeler and her husband Warren Howeler, of Athens, PA; special great-nephew Jonathan Howeler and great-niece Grace Howeler, whom she adored and they adored her back; niece Anna Pasquale and her husband Bruce and children David and Evan of Jacksonville, N.C.; nephew Aaron Taylor and Nike Thurston of Jacksonville, N.C.; brother-in-law, Michael Taylor of Jacksonville, N.C.; and an aunt, Peggy Coleman of Cary, N.C.
