



## Frances Brown Potter

October 7, 1926 - May 3, 2019

Frances Brown Potter, 92, known fondly to many as "Ma Potter" and "Grandma Potter" of North Orwell, PA, passed away peacefully Friday morning, May 3, 2019 at home where she resided with her daughter, Cindi Mize. Frances was born October 7, 1926 in Stevensville, PA one of 12 children to Julia and Claude Brown. On June 21, 1946, Frances married Richard J. Potter at the North Towanda United Methodist Church. Together they raised seven children. In early years, Frances was employed by the Blue Swan Sewing Factory in Sayre and by the Camptown Dress Factory. She later served as cafeteria manager for the Northeast Bradford High School for over 25 years until retirement. Frances will be remembered as a kind, loving, and giving person and for her love of her family. She loved everyone she met and she touched the hearts of countless people. She was not only mom to her children but many others that she took into her heart. Her legacy will live on in the hearts of all those she touched. Frances is best known for her yodeling. She yodeled for everyone, everywhere she went she would yodel. She especially loved to yodel with her daughters, the Potter Sisters, and did so everywhere they sang.
