George Leslie Kerrick, 93, a lifelong resident of French Asylum, Pa, passed away Thursday morning, April 26, 2012 at his home.

George was born at home on August 15, 1918 the son of Sheldon H. and Mae Taylor Kerrick. He attended the French Asylum School and was a graduate of Towanda High School class of 1935.

On December 15, 1945 George married the former Dorothy L. Beers of Monroeton at the Monroeton United Methodist Church. He was preceded in death by his wife of 64 years on December 31, 2009.

George started farming with his father and uncle, and later became sole owner and operator of Frenrick Farms. He was a member of the French Asylum Methodist Church; Wysox Lodge No. 1152 IOOF, served as trustee of the French Asylum Cemetery Association; and was a past member of Asylum Grange, Bradford Sullivan Pomona Grange and National Grange. While dairy farming, George was a 40-year leader of Susqui 4-H Club and was active in the local and state Holstein Association. He was the recipient of the 1990 Bradford County Cooperator Award. He also served as trustee of the French Asylum Methodist Church, Wysox School Authority and the Towanda Valley Joint Authority. George enjoyed hunting, fishing, playing softball and gardening.
