June 6, 1937 - January 25, 2022

Leslie E. Selleck, 84, of Sayre, PA passed away on Tuesday, January 25, 2022, at the Robert Packer Hospital, surrounded by his loving family.

Les, as he was affectionately known, was born on June 6, 1937, in the Mills Hospital, Towanda, PA the son of Eleanor M. Selleck Lattimer and Waldo Selleck.

Les graduated from Athens Area High School in 1956. He served in the United States Army and received an Honorable Discharge in 1966. Les was employed with Ingersoll Rand before taking a position at IBM, as a toolmaker. He worked for IBM, which eventually became Lockheed Martin, and retired as a Master Toolmaker with more than 40 years of service, at the age of 75. He was a communicant of the Church of Epiphany, Sayre, PA. He was a member of the Athens American Legion Post 246 and the National Rifle Association. Les loved spending time with his family and friends. One of his greatest attributes was his ability to tell a story and make people laugh. He had many interests, but most notably was his love of history, particularly the Civil War. He loved old cars, the Lehigh Valley Railroad, firearms, going to flea markets, spending summer vacations in Oak Island, NC and Lake George, NY with his family, and he was an avid New York Yankees fan.

He was preceded in death by his parents, and sisters, Shirley Deprospero and Cynthia Kerndt.

Les is survived by his companion, Ann Rogers, of Athens, PA, his sisters Nancy (Ray) Maxim of South Waverly, PA, MaryLou (Ed) Wertz, of Wellsboro,
