April 17, 1930 - October 20, 2022

Pauline L. Farr 92, of Waverly, NY passed away Thursday, October 20, 2022. Born in Athens, Pennsylvania, on April 17, 1930, she was the daughter of John and Nora Coveney Farr.

Pauline had a strong faith in God. She was a member of Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church, the choir, and an adorer at the Epiphany Adoration Chapel for many years. Pauline attended grade school in Greens Landing and graduated from Athens High School. She worked part-time during high school caring for children of a local lawyer.
