Ronald Lee Wickwire, known by most as Ronnie or Ron, age 67, of LeRaysville, PA passed away Tuesday, April 29, 2025, as the result of a motor vehicle accident.

He then went directly to work with the family business and later taking over, Wickwire Trucking and Wickwire Supply until retirement.
