



## Scott Richard Gore

Scott Richard Gore was born December 12, 1957, to Carl and Fran Gore of Luthers Mills, PA. Scott grew up on his family farm and graduated from Troy High School in 1977. After high school, Scott's wanderlust kicked in and he took jobs across the nation. Throughout the various roles he had, there was always a constant: equipment and agriculture. Scott came home regularly to visit, help on the family farm, and catch up with old friends. As his parents got older, their request to come home and help keep the farm going was not something Scott could refuse. He came back to Luthers Mills and farmed alongside his brother Jim for many years.

Scott was a complex man with a great appreciation for the simple things in life. Forever a stoic, he didn't let many past surface level, but he spent plenty of time turning things over and sharing his insights with the people he cared about. More than one person in the neighborhood can recall a time they had a multi-hour talk with him, covering every topic you can imagine. Scott found joy in watching sunsets – “A new one each day” he always said, while drinking a cold beer, and listening to music. He was faithful and loved to listen to radio shows and podcasts that expanded his faith and his understanding of the world here and beyond, often while he was enjoying God's creation around him from his favorite perch, the driver's seat of his truck.

He was perennially tenderhearted, valuing animals and children for the joy

they brought to the world around them. Many times he would be seen loving up on a barn cat while waiting for a milker, scratching a calf behind the ears, or dropping Lebanon bologna for a dog to snack. Kids often saw him as a gentle giant, because rather than fearing the man that towered over them, they were drawn to him, with his big smile, sparkling eyes, and his easy laugh. He was “Uncle Scott” to many kids and he took great joy in watching them grow up. Scott cared deeply for his family and friends, and he loved to hear the latest developments in their lives.

Scott is preceded in death by his parents, Carl (2007) and Fran (2016) and nephew Abel Harrington (2023). He is survived by his brother, James (Susan) Gore of Luthers Mills, PA and his sister, Alice Stickler of Wellsboro, PA. He is also survived by his aunt, Norma Moore, of Towanda, and numerous nieces and nephews: Melisa Gore (Ronald Wheeler) and sons Nicholas and Zachary; Julie (Nathan) Harrington and daughter Juliette; Jolene (Joseph) White and son Paul; Caleb (Kari) Gore and daughters Larissa, Emilee, Brylee, and Lacey; Dorothy (Thomas) Scott and sons Hunter and Levi; Rebekah Gore (Kyle Hakes) and son Trent and daughter Serenity.
