Sheldon A. Clark Jr., 85, of Towanda, PA passed away Sunday, February 3, 2013 at Memorial Hospital, Towanda. Sheldon was born in Mount Vernon, NY on June 3, 1927 the son of Sheldon A. Clark Sr. and Audrey H. Smith Clark. He attended Wysox Elementary School and was a graduate of Towanda High School. Sheldon was a graduate of Santa Monica, CA City College class of 1954 and the University of Alaska, Fairbanks, AK class of 1961. He served in the U.S. Merchant Marines and the U.S. Army in Germany and Korea. Sheldon was employed in various maritime industry related occupations as Merchant Seaman, Export Traffic Management and United Seamen's Service Port Director until joining U.S. Civil Service in 1964. He returned to live in Towanda following his retirement from the U.S. Customs Service in New York City in 1985 but continued his lifelong interest in traveling.

His survivors include his cousins and their families; Scott Wickwire of Wysox and Constance Clark Howard of Johnson City, TN.

A private funeral service will be held at the convenience of the family. There are no calling hours.
