Thomas W. Bennett, 85, formerly of Monroeton, PA passed away Thursday, October 17, 2019 at the Elderwood Health Care Center in Waverly, NY where he had been a resident for the past year.

Thomas was born in New Era, PA on October 14, 1934, one of 11 children to Leon Bennett and Millie Huffman Bennett. He was a graduate of Ulster High School, Ulster, PA with the class of 1952 and was employed by Westinghouse in Horseheads, NY until 1955 when he went to work at the Ingersoll-Rand in Athens, PA. Thomas retired from Ingersoll-Rand in 1996 following 41 years of service and was subsequently employed by Sheshequin Township and continued the operation of his farm in Monroe Township which he had maintained for many years in addition to his employment.
